## CORRESPONDENCE:

ROCKAWAY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF HEALTH - May 28, 2021 we had 249 cases. Since then there have been 0 new cases.

NAVIGATING HOPE /FAMILY PROMISE OF MORRIS COUNTY - They contacted me wanting to bring a van here at our firehouse to let people apply for SNAP, Medicaid, Genreal Assistance, TANF, Utility Assistance and Housing Assistance. They want to come in on June 10 and June 24, 2021.

Councilwoman Cheatham asked how residents will be notified. They will reach out from their end and we will put it on our website. It is too late to do a flier for the 10th but I can probably get somethign out for the 24th.

NEW LISTING FROM DOVER SCHOOLS - I was sent a new listing of the Victory Gardens children attending the Dover Schools. They say we have 279 kids going to school. I checked over the list and the addresses and they are all in Victory Gardens.

The breakdown as I see the names and addresses follows:

4 children in an Apartment in Victory Hill East

Brook Run Apartments they are 4 different apartments with 3 kids in each 1 house had 5 children 1 house 3 children 1 house 4 children 1 house 3 children

That makes a total of 37 kids where there is overcrowding in the homes. Councilman Lorenzo asked if they are all living here? According to the list from Dover, yes. They are all renters.

Councilwoman Montes asked if they can only have 3? It depends on the house

and how many bedrooms.

The Clerk said most of the houses in here are 2 bedrooms. You have 2 family homes that are only 1 bedroom on each side. Then you have some single family homes that have 3 bedrooms. Last year I sent letters which resulted in people moving. I will be sending letters again unless the Council tells me not to. The letters will go to the landlords. Although, right now there isn't too much that can be done. There is a moratorium that the Governor put on so that people can't be kicked out of the homes even if they haven't paid rent. Council said ok to send letters.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE UPDATE - The Mayor said that everyone received a copy of the update.

Councilwoman Cheatham asked if these were updates? Yes and no. They are taken from the State Code. Ron felt we needed more clarification on the

Councilman Lorenzo asked about the last page that says 15 days prior to a holiday and 15 days after a holiday the decorations must be removed. Clerk said this number of days can be changed. You have different cultures in here and more time should be given.

Council agreed that decorations can be put up 60 days before the holiday and takendown 60 days after the holiday.

The Clerk also mentioned on this paragraph you have to say what the penalties are.

TheClerk said there is something missing as in a clean and sanitary what? The Attorney said condition. Okay that needs to be put in there.

Also, Councilman Glass had issue with the height of hedges, fences, etc. I told them these resitrictions are for intersections The Attorney said that is correct.

Yard waste collection 12:2-10 - There are no scheduled or announced pickups for yardwaste. That needs to come out. Everythigh has to be bagged and put to the curb.

12:2-12 Inoperable vehicles - It says on the public right of way. should say not allowed on private property at all. Councilwoman Montes said they can have them on rocks. No the Clerk said. You still can not have an inoperable vehicle on your property and you can't have one that is unlicensed.

12:2-14 Disposal of grass nad weeds - The last lineneeds to come out. We don't have a scheduled pickup by the Borough. As long as everyting is put in bags and goes to the curb it is picked up everyday.

Councilman Lorenzo said the height of the grass should be 10 inches,

not 6. Sometimes it rains and you can't get to the grass.

These are the changes given to the Attorney. The Attorney asked if the Property Maintenance person looked this over? Yes and so did the Construction Official. They are both good with it.

AWARD CONTRACT FOR COOLIDGE, JEFFERSON AND MONROE AVENUES The Attorney has the contracts. They are in order and Riverview Paving is the lowest responsible bidder.

The Clerk said there were 6 bids received. They ranged from \$92,722.55 from Riverview Paving to a high of \$192,611.60.

Leon recommends awarding to Riverview Paving.

UPDATE CANNABIS ORDINANCE - The attorney sent he sent a modified revision. Council will look over and be ready at the next meeting.

The Clerk suggested we talk about it at the next meeting so we can introduce and adopt in July.

#### OLD BUSINESS CONTINUED:

CODIFY ORDINANCES - The Clerk said this was put on the agenda so we can get a vote form the Council. You did say you would do this. We can't do it this year but if you approve it then it can go into the budget for next year.

Motion was made to codify the ordinances next year with Councils approval this year. Motion made by Councilwoman Montes, seconded by Councilwoman Cheatham and approved on roll call vote:

DOT IDEAS - Leon wanted me to check with Council again. He wants to do a big project with DOT monies. He wants to start on Washington Avenue from the condos past both apartment complexes and stop at Roosevelt Avenue.

Leon wants to ask DOT \$125,000. With that we never get full funding, so he is thinking if we are lucky we may get \$95,000. So if he does the whole scope of work, then the Borough would have to put in \$45,000 to \$50,000 of their money from Capital.

Leon asked meto find out if you would go for this work and if you do - how much are you comfortable with using from our Capital Fund? DOT never funds 100% of any project. The town always has to put in a portion.

The Clerk said you can cut the project down depending on what amount of money

you want to take out of Capital.

Attorney Feintuch said that if this has to be done, it will only get more expensive if you keep putting it off. Prices are always going up. You should listen to his recommendation. This will go out for bid.

Council agreed on no more than \$25,000 coming out of Capital. Motion made by Councilwoman Hedgepath, seconded by Councilwoman Montes and approved on roll call:

Motion was made to open the meeting to the public by Councilwoman Montes, seconded by Councilwoman Hedgepath and approved on verbal vote. None opposed.

Christopher Trotsky - In regards to what Debbe was saying about the overcrowding in town, did you hire a housing inspector? The Clerk said we did not. The person we hired as our Zoning Officer is also a housing inspector but they did not hire him for that. What the Attorney was saying about the code book being on line and codifying the ordinances - can you speak on that? The Attonrey said that earlier the Clerk asked if we could do this. We had a lot of ordinances that needed to be updated and put in the book. Council did not agree to do it. We had our ordinances on line at one time because Coded Systems put it there as a courtesy. Once Council disapproved the update, they removed from the site. Since this was denied at one time, can you put it up for vote again and that is legal? Of course it is.

Jim Janone - Attorney Feintuch asked the Mayor not to put him on the timer yet as he has a question for him. What makes you think that you have the authority to ask for phone bills from any member of this Body? Are you answering my OPRA request that I submitted today? Yes. There is case law on this. They are using their phones to conduct public business. Case law says that if it was used for public business, such as a Coucnil meeting, it is under OPRA and can be requested. The Mayor asked Jim if it is different when someone from the public texts someone up on Council during a meeting?

With the DOT grant, don't you think we should figure out the problem that is causing this to happen and fix that? I think a lot of this has to do with water runoff. The Mayor siad it is wear and tear. RVRSA litigation—we must have some type of news on this because the Attorney put in a bill for over \$9,000. The Attorney said the testimony in the trial has officially ended. Trial is not over yet because briefs have to be written. This has been going on for 10 years. Appeals will always be part of the process. About the kids in here going to school—do you know if all these people with the overcrowding are related? No, I don't know. By the list Dover gave me, they have the same last names.

# PUBLIC PORTION CONTINUED:

Jim Janone Continued - You don't have to have a housing officer. I know for overcrowding it can be an imeninent hazard and the fire official can do it. The Clerk said she asked Chris who is our fire official and he said he can't do. He said he isn't at liberty to that. It has to be a rental property then he can go in. The Clerk said she only knows this information because the shoool gave it to me. Dover has an enforcement officer that does this type of thing. They always had one. The school boards have an enforcement officer. Why can't they come in and do this? With property maintenance you may want to put something in there about religious lights and memorials. There are people that have religious lights up and memorials. Think about that for this property maintenance code.

Motion to close our meeting to the public by Councilwoman Montes, seconded by Councilwoman Cheatham and approved on verbal vote. None oppsoed.
